

## BIOGRAPHY - Harry M. Siegel

**Mr. Harry M. Siegel** has over 30 years of project resource management and marketing experience, the last 25 years of which have involved the direction of large organizations and multimillion-dollar operations. He holds a M.S. Degree in Computer Systems from the Naval Postgraduate School, and a B.S. Degree in Analytical Management from the U.S. Naval Academy. He is a highly decorated Service Disabled Vietnam Veteran. He is the founder and CEO of HMS TECHNOLOGIES, INC., which is a certified Service Disabled Veteran-Owned Business providing information technology integration services to a host of clients from the Federal Government and to commercial entities throughout the United States and abroad. HMS is a VETS GWAC prime and was selected as one of DoD's SDVOSBs of the Year for 2007. The corporation has been nominated for Small Business of the Year for West Virginia and the Nation.

Mr. Siegel's national recognition for his Artificial Intelligence (AI) expertise is demonstrated by having served as International Chairman for the Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) Technical Committee on Expert Systems Applications for three and one half years; National Chairman for the IEEE Task Force on Expert Systems, which included over 2,000 professionals; Vice Chairman for Panels for the AI Systems in Government '90 Conference; and Chairman for the Managing Expert Systems Conference for IEEE. He is also a board member of the Internal Scientific Committee of the International Association of Knowledge Engineers. Mr. Siegel's expertise encompasses the following areas: AI software development; Grants Management automation program management; evaluation, development, and implementation of databases; independent verification and validation (IV&V); management information systems; automated data processing (ADP) system design, maintenance, and operation; and computer facility design. Mr. Siegel has provided over 10 million lines of computer code and delivered highly successful large technical integration projects to the U.S. Government and foreign nations. He has been the systems designer/architect of many of largest and most successful software systems developed and delivered for HHS including *IMPACT* which tracks all medical grants for NIH, *NPDB* which needs to be accessed by all U.S. hospitals prior to giving hospital privileges to medical doctors for HRSA, *SMART* for electronic submission of new drug applications to the FDA, *SDPS* for Peer Review reporting on all Medicare claims for CMS, He has been responsible for the implementation of more than 500 Electronic Medical Record installations in hospitals around the nation and performed development and testing on DoD's *CHCS* system for all healthcare delivery to active duty personnel and their dependents.

Mr. Siegel won the coveted Ronald Reagan Gold Medal in 2005 for Small Business Excellence, was named 2005 Business Man of the year by the NRCC, and Empire Who's Who IT Systems Integrator of the year for 2005-2006. He was the awardee for the SBA's Veteran Advocate of the year for 2006, and won the Congressional Medal of Distinction in 2007 for Small Business Excellence.
